Minister's oversight visit to North West province housing projects

The Minister of Human Settlements, Mmamoloko Kubayi, led a delegation to the North West Province on 6 and 07 December 2021, as part of efforts by government to ramp up the provision of sustainable human settlements for all.

Minister Kubayi conducted on-site inspections of various housing projects in Rusternburg and Moses Kotane Local Municipalities, including N12 Housing Mega project in Matlosana Local Municipality in the North West Province. She further handed over Title Deeds to qualifying beneficiaries accompanied by the MEC for Cooperative Governance, Human Settlements and Traditional Affairs (GoGHSTA) Ms Lena Miga, HDA Chairperson Dr Tshilidzi Ratshitanga, Acting CEO Daphney Ngoasheng and the Executive Mayors of the affected municipalities.

Some of the qualifying beneficiaries included 90 years-old Christian Katrina, Mamosebetsi Leanya (74), Joshia Pai (73), Mzwandile Mgweni (70) and Herbert Nyokana (77).

Upon receiving their Title Deeds, the deserving beneficiaries lauded the government for restoring their dignity. This included the elderly and people living with disabilities.

Among others, Minister Mmamoloko and NW MEC, Ms Lena Miga visited Gabonewe Social Housing Project, built in partnerships between the North West Province, Moses Kotane Local Municipalities, SHRA and a mining company.

In the North West Province, the agency plays a key role in our secondary mandate of Programme Management of Catalytic projects, particularly in the Matlosana N12 and Bokamoso Catalytic Projects

which the Minister also visited. Some of the significant achievements in the North West include the release of 6 639 hectares of stateowned land and acquisition of 3 356 hectares of privately owned land and installations of 7 152 serviced stands within the various Local Municipalities in the North West province in both catalytic and noncatalytic projects.

Among other beneficiaries who received their Title-Deeds from the Minister, included 73-year-old Joshua Pai, and 77-year-old Herbert Nyokana.
