1. Introduction

- 1.1. The Housing Development Agency (HDA) is a national public development agency, established by an Act of Parliament (Act 23 of 2008). The HDA promotes sustainable communities by making well-located land and buildings available for the development of human settlements. As its primary activity, the HDA assembles state, private and communal land and buildings and releases it for development. - 1.2. The HDA seeks to appoint a service provider to provide the HDA with access to a digital Legal Research Tool to access amongst others: National and Regional Legislation; Updated Case Law; Labour Law books and Case Law and Corporate Laws with Companies Act commentary, etc.

2. Description

2.1. The HDA seeks to contract with a service provider that can provide a digital platform to be used, in order to access and/or obtain legal research and/or information; the latest legal developments and best practices in the legal sphere.

3. Scope of work

- 3.1. The Service Provider is required to provide licences for 05(Five) users, accessing the platform simultaneously.

4. Contract Duration

4.1. The contract will be valid for a period of thirty-six (36) months.

5. Evaluation Process

- 5.1. In order to facilitate a transparent selection process that allows equal opportunity to all service providers, the HDA has a policy for the appointment of service providers.

6. Payment Structure

- 6.1. HDA is to be billed (invoiced) monthly in accordance with the monthly subscription fee for the contract period.

- 7.1. Below are compulsory requirements for the services:
 - 7.1.1. It is important to note that the successful bidder will work under the supervision of an HDA representative, abide by HDA's Code of conduct, and other organizational guidelines.
 - 7.1.2. All users to be registered under one account.
 - 7.1.3. Bidders should have existing systems in place with services being available within 2 working days of signing of the Service Level Agreement.
 - 7.1.4. The HDA may request a trial period of 2 weeks for trial purposes, prior to appointment of the successful bidder.
- 7.2. The following documents must be submitted:
 - A company profile
 - A valid tax clearance certificate
 - Certificates issued by the following agencies SANAS, IRBA or CCA.
