Under such circumstances, the validity of the bids of the next ranked bidder(s) will be deemed to remain valid, irrespective of whether the next ranked bidder(s) were issued with a Letter of Regret. Bidders may therefore be requested to advise



whether they would still be prepared to provide the required goods at their quoted price, even after they have been issued with a Letter of Regret.

The HDA will not reimburse any Bidder for any preparatory costs or other work performed in connection with its Proposal, whether or not the Bidder is awarded a contract.

- **3.4** any reference to natural persons shall include legal persons and vice versa;
- 3.5 words defined in a specific clause have the same meaning in all other clauses of the RFP, unless the contrary is specifically indicated;
- any reference to the RFP, schedule or appendix, shall be construed as including a reference to any RFP, schedule or appendix amending or substituting that RFP, schedule or appendix;
- 3.7 the schedules, appendices and Briefing Notes issued pursuant to this RFP, form an indivisible part of the RFP and together with further clarifying and amending information provided by the HDA, constitute the body of RFP documentation which must be complied with by Bidders;

4 DEFINITIONS

- **4.4** "Bidders Briefing Session" means the compulsory or non-compulsory briefing session to be held at the offices of the HDA or at a venue that will be arranged by the HDA, in order to brief the Bidders about this tender;

4. SPECIFIC GOALS

As explained in more detail in the attached SBD 6.1 (Specific Goals Preference Points Claim Form) and as prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and its Regulations, Bidders are to note that the HDA will award "Specific Goals points" to companies who provide valid proof of their status as requested in the bid document.



4.2. SPECIFIC GOALS FOR JOINT VENTURES OR CONSORTIUMS

Bidders who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Bidders must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party.

Bidders are to note the requirements for specific goals compliance of JVs or consortiums as required by SBD 6.1 [the specific goals Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their consolidated specific goals as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain preference points.

5. COMMUNICATION

For specific queries relating to this RFP during the RFP process, bidders are required to adhere strictly to the communication structure requirements. Queries should be submitted to Tender3@thehda.co.za on or before **16h30pm on 17 January 2025**

- 5.2. In the interest of fairness and transparency the HDA's response to such a query will be made available to the Bidders on the National Treasury E-Tender portal and the HDA's Website.
- 5.3. After the closing date of the RFP, a Bidder may only communicate in writing with the SCM Official, at Tender3@thehda.co.za on any matter relating to its RFP Proposal.
- 5.4. Bidders are to note that changes to its submission will not be considered after the closing date.
- 5.5. Bidders are warned that a response will be liable for disqualification should any attempt be made by a Bidder either directly or indirectly to canvass any officer(s) or employee of the HDA in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business. Furthermore, Bidders found to be in collusion with one another will automatically be disqualified and restricted from doing business with the HDA in future.

6. CONFIDENTIALITY

6.2. The HDA shall ensure all information related to this RFP is to be treated with strict confidence. In this regard Bidder / Bidders are required to certify that they have acquainted themselves with the Non-Disclosure Agreement. All information related to a subsequent contract, both during and after completion thereof, will be treated with strict confidence. Should the need however arise to divulge any



information gleaned from provision of the Services, which is either directly or indirectly related to the HDA's business, written approval to divulge such information must be obtained from the HDA.

6.3. Bidders must clearly indicate whether any information submitted or requested from the HDA is confidential or should be treated confidentially by the HDA. In the absence of any such clear indication in writing, the HDA shall deem the response to the RFP to have waived any right to confidentiality and treat such information as public in nature.

7. INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE RFP

- 7.2. All responses to the RFP must be submitted in two sealed envelopes/boxes; the first envelop/box shall have the technical, compliance and specific goals response and the second envelop/box shall only have the financial response. Bidders must ensure that they do not indicate any financial information in the first envelop/box. the HDA may disqualify Bidders who fail to adhere to this requirement.
- 7.3. Bidders are required to package their response/Bid as follows to avoid disqualification:

Volume 1 (Envelop 1/Package 1)

- Part A: Compliance Response
- Part B: Technical or Functional Response (response to scope of work)

Volume 2 (Envelop 2/ Package 2)

Part C: Financial Proposal and specific goals (SBD6.1)

Volume 2 Has to be submitted in a separate sealed envelope. Bidders must make their pricing offer in envelop 2/package 2, NO PRICING AND PRICING RELATED INFORMATION SHOULD BE INCLUDED IN THE VOLUME 1 ENVELOP 1.

- 7.4. Bidders must submit 1 original response, and electronic version which must be contained in USB clearly marked in the Bidders name.
- 7.5. Bidders must ensure that their response to the RFP is in accordance with the structure of this document.
- 7.6. Where Bidders are required to sign forms they are required to do so using a black ink pen.
- 7.7. Any documents forming part of the original responses to RFP but which are not original in nature, must be certified as a true copy by a Commissioner of Oaths.



- 7.8. Each response to RFP must be in English and submitted in A4 format, except other graphic illustrations, which may not exceed A3 format, unless the contrary is specifically allowed for in this RFP. Responses to RFP must be neatly and functionally bound, preferably according to their different sections.
- 7.9. The original responses to RFP must be signed by a person duly authorized by each consortium member and Subcontractor to sign on their behalf, which authorization must form part of the responses to RFP as proof of authorization. By signing the responses to RFP the signatory warrants that all information supplied by it in its responses to RFP is true and correct and that the responses to RFP and each party whom the responses to RFP signatory represents, considers themselves subject to and bound by the terms and conditions of this RFP.
- 7.10. The responses to RFP formulation must be clear and concise and follow a clear methodology which responses to RFP must explain upfront in a concise Executive Summary and follow throughout the responses to RFP.
- 7.11. Responses to RFP must provide sufficient information and detail in order to enable the HDA to evaluate the responses to RFP, but should not provide unnecessary detail which does not add value and detracts from the ability of the HDA to effectively evaluate and understand the responses to RFP. The use of numbered headings, bullet points, sections, appendices and schedules are encouraged.
- 7.12. Information submitted as part of a responses to RFP must as far as possible, be ordered according to the order of the required information requested by the HDA. All pages must be consecutively numbered.
- 7.13. Responses to RFP must ensure that each requirement contained in the RFP is succinctly addressed. Responses to RFP should as far as possible use the terms and definitions applied in this RFP and should clearly indicate its interpretation of any differing terminology applied.
- 7.14. Response to RFP documents are to be submitted to the address specified in paragraph 3 above, and Bidders must ensure that the original and copies (where applicable) are identical in all respects as the HDA will not accept any liability for having disqualified a bidder for failing to provide a mandatory returnable document.
- **7.15.** Unless otherwise expressly stated, all Proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.

8. LEGAL COMPLIANCE

Bidders must ensure that they comply with all the requirements of the RFP and if Bidders fail to submit any of the required documents, such Bids shall, at the sole discretion of the HDA, be disqualified the



Bidder. The HDA reserves the right to call a Bidder to provide additional documents which the HDA may require from a Bidder which have not been submitted to the HDA.

Bidders must ensure that they comply with all the requirements of the RFP and if Bidders fail to submit any of the required documents, such Bids shall, at the sole discretion of the HDA, be disqualified.

The successful Bidder [hereinafter referred to as the **Service Provider**] shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable laws and regulations.

9. NATIONAL TREASURY'S CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

Bidders are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. 10. TAX COMPLIANCE

Bidders must be compliant when submitting a proposal to the HDA and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this RFP that the tax matters of the successful bidder be in order

The Tax Compliance status requirements are also applicable to foreign Bidders/ individuals who wish to submit bids.

Bidders are required to be registered on the CSD as indicated in paragraph 9 and the National Treasury shall verify the Bidder's tax compliance status through the CSD.

Where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must be registered on the CSD and their tax compliance status will be verified through the CSD.

For this purpose, the attached SBD 1 must be completed and submitted as an essential returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid.



New Tax Compliance Status (TCS) System

SECTION 2

BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. Introduction

This document outlines the Terms of Reference (ToR) for the procurement of a service provider to provide 400 (4m X 4m X 0,3m concrete ground slabs for structures that will be erected at the Driftsands project Phase 1.

2. The Housing Development Agency (HDA)

The Housing Development Agency (HDA) is a national public development agency which promotes sustainable communities by making well located and appropriately planned land available for the development of human settlements. As its primary activity, the HDA assembles state, private and communal land and releases it for development. In addition, HDA provides project delivery support services to organs of state at local, provincial, and national level. Visit www.thehda.co.za for more information.

3. Background

The Driftsands Nature Reserve has been subject to systematic land invasion for many years, but since July 2020 the reserve experienced a mass in-migration of people, vehicles and materials into the general area that resulted in more than 8000 informal structures counted on the Nature Reserve by September 2020. It has continued to grow to affect the dam area.

CapeNature has proceeded with a legal process to address this unlawful occupation. This legal process resulted in a ruling of the Western Cape High Court (on 04 November 2020) that any operations pertaining to the dismantling and removal of structures were to be set aside in favour of an order to launch an application for eviction proceedings in terms of The Prevention of Illegal Eviction from Unlawful Occupation of Land, Act No. 19 of 1998 (PIE Act). CapeNature states that due to the rate and scale of migration into the reserve, full implementation of the court order amounts to a mass eviction and that this organisation does not have the resources to undertake such an action.

The critical aspect is that the people residing in the dam area, needs to be moved, before the winter season arrives. This applied pressure to the Departments in addressing the conservation of the Nature Reserve compared to the provision of shelter for these households.

An Inter-Governmental Working Group has been established consisting of various relevant Provincial Sector Departments (DEA&DP and Dol), the City of Cape Town and Cape Nature. This working group



is being chaired by the Provincial Department of Environmental Affairs and Development Planning (DEA&DP).

The involvement of the Department of Infrastructure (DoI), and its Human Settlements Branch in addressing the situation on Driftsands Reserve revolves around the following possible actions:

- Assist the landowner (DPW), land user (CapeNature) and local authority (City of Cape Town) in protecting the site from further illegal occupation;
- Assist with the relocation of inhabitants situated in dangerous locations on-site;
- Provision of interim basic services as needed on-site;
- High-level scoping of the site to determine potential relocation areas on-site and future human settlement potential of the site;
- Assist the local authority to unblock existing human settlement development projects on the site;
- Assist in developing a relocation strategy for the current inhabitants with the landowner, land user and Local Authority; and
- Or potentially undertake a human settlement development project on-site.

The Phase1 project, the rehabilitation (levelling) of the site, has been completed in October 2024. The geotechnical investigation, "Annexure A", was conducted to assist with the identification of suitable sites and recommendations on preparation of layer works for the emergency relocations of temporary informal structures to Driftsands site. The work was undertaken in accordance with the National Department of Housing Geotechnical Site Investigations for Housing Developments Generic Specification GFSH-2 September 2002. Attached is the geotechnical report which constitutes a near-surface geotechnical investigation of the above-mentioned specific development only.

The next phase of the development is to relocate the 400 households to the completed site. However, before the relocation of the 400 households can be started, the concrete slab must be constructed and the and temporary structure must be erected as required in accordance with the finalised Driftsands layout plan. The layout plan and the stands set out plan is attached as "Annexure B and C".

It was agreed with the Department of Infrastructure, Human Settlement Branch (DoI) to provide the concrete slab with the temporary structure for the relocation of the 400 households.

The site has been levelled with G5 material. The next phase of the work to be done is for a concrete slab to be constructed and for the temporary structures to be erected onto the concrete slab. No compaction of the soil is required as the G5 material has already been compacted and the site is ready for the 400 concrete slabs to be constructed.



4. SITE LOCALITY

Driftsands is a nature reserve located near Cape Town, South Africa, in the Western Cape Province. It is situated between and on the intersection of the R300 and the N2 highway near and it was known for its diverse plant and bird species. The Reserve is situated in the suburb of Blue Downs and is bordered by Brentwood Park to the north, Delft-South to the west, Mfuleni to the east while the N2 forms the southern border. The Reserve falls within City of Cape Town's Ward 114 and Sub-council 22. The Reserve is approximately 24km from the City of Cape Town Central Business District (CBD) and approximately 7km from the Cape Town International Airport. The project is located approximately at 33°59'48" S latitude and 18°28'33" E longitude.




Figure 1: Map indicating locality of Driftsands

5. Objectives

The primary objectives of this procurement are:



- To engage a qualified service provider who will provide 400 4m X 4m concrete slabs for structures that will be erected at the Driftsands project Phase 1
- Concrete slab to be constructed before the structure is erected.
- To ensure that the provision 400 4m X 4m concrete slabs meet all regulatory, safety, and quality standards.
- To complete the project within the specified timeframe and budget in conjunction with the POW for the erecting of the structures.
- Service provider to submit a layout plan depicting the final positioning of slabs: Site plan to comply with the relevant statutory requirements

8. GENERAL CONDITIONS

8.1. THE HDA'S TENDER FORMS

Bidders must sign and complete the HDA's Bid Forms and attach all the required documents. Failure by Bidders to adhere to this requirement may lead to their disqualification.

8.2. PRECEDENT

In case of any conflict with this RFP and Bidders response, this RFP and its briefing notes shall take precedence.

8.3. RESPONSE TO RFP-CONFIDENTIALITY

Response to RFPs must clearly indicate whether any information conveyed to or requested from the HDA is confidential or should be treated confidentially by the HDA. In the absence of any such clear indication in writing from a response to RFP, the HDA shall deem the response to RFP to have waived any right to confidentiality and treat such information as public in nature.

Where a Bidder at any stage during the RFP Process indicates to the HDA that information or any response to RFP requested from the HDA is or should be treated confidentially, the HDA shall treat such information or response to RFP confidentially, unless the HDA believes that to ensure the transparency and competitiveness of the RFP Process the content of the information or response to RFP should be conveyed to all Bidders, in which event it shall apply the following process:

 The HDA shall confirm with the Bidder whether the raising of confidentiality applies to the entire response to the RFP or only specific elements or sections of the response;



- Where confidentiality is maintained by the Bidder and the HDA is of the opinion that the information or response to RFP if made publicly available would affect the commercial interests of the Bidder or is commercially sensitive information, the HDA shall not release such information to other Bidders if providing such information or response to the RFP would prejudice the competitiveness and transparency of the RFP Process;
- Where the HDA is of the opinion that information provided is not commercially sensitive or would have no impact on the commercial interests of the relevant Bidder if released and fairness and transparency requires that such information be released to all Bidders, the HDA may:

8.5. CORRUPTION, GIFTS AND PAYMENTS

Neither the Bidders to RFPs, its equity members, the sub-contractors, consortium members nor any of their agents, lenders or advisors shall directly or indirectly offer or give to any person in the employment of the HDA or any other Government official or any of the Advisory Team any gift or consideration of any kind as an inducement or reward for appointing a particular Bidder, or for showing or omitting to show favour or disfavour to any of the Bidders, its equity members or the sub-contractors in relation to the Project.

In the event that any of the prohibited practices contemplated under the above paragraph is committed, the HDA shall be entitled to terminate any Response to RFP's status and to prohibit such Bids to RFP, its equity members, its Sub Contractors and their agents, lenders and advisors from participating in any further part of the procurement of the Project.

8.6. INSURANCE

Unless specifically provided for in this RFP or draft contracts, Bidders will be required to submit with their Bid for services professional indemnity insurance and works insurance to an extent (if any) if insurance provided by the HDA may not be for the full cover required in terms of the relevant category listed in this RFP. The Bidder is advised to seek qualified advice regarding insurance.

8.7. NO CONTACT POLICY

Bidders may only contact the supply chain official of the HDA as per the terms of the Communication Structure established by this RFP, except in the case of pre-existing commercial relationships, in which case contact may be maintained only with respect thereto and, in making such contact, no party may make reference to the Project or this RFP.

8.8. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

No Bidder member, subcontractor or advisor of the response to RFP may be a member of or in any other way participate or be involved, either directly or indirectly in more than one response to RFP or response to RFP during any stage of the Project procurement process, but excluding specialist suppliers of systems and equipment, non-core service providers or financial or commercial institutions whose role is limited purely to lending money or advancing credit to the response to RFP. Bidders are to sign the declaration of interest form. In order to prevent the conflict or potential conflict of interest



between Lenders and Bidders to RFP, no advisors or the Contractor/s or Consortium/s to any response to RFP, consortium member or subcontractor may fulfil the role of arranger, underwriter and/or lead bank to the response to RFP. The HDA may disqualify the response to RFP from further participation in the event of a failure to comply with this provision. The HDA views the potential conflict of interest so great as to warrant the reduction of competition for advisory services.

8.9. COLLUSION AND CORRUPTION

Any Bidder shall, without prejudice to any other remedy available to the HDA, be disqualified, where the response to RFP –

- communicates to a person other than persons nominated by the HDA a material part of its response to RFP; or
- enters into any Contract or arrangement with any other person or entity that it shall refrain from submitting a response to RFP to this RFP or as to any material part of its Response to RFP to this RFP (refer the prohibition contained in Section 4(1)(b)(iii) of the Competition Act 89 of 1998). The Bidders represents that the Bidder has not, directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, arrangement or understanding or any such like for the purpose of, with the intention to, enter into collusive Biding or with reasonable appreciation that, collusive any agreement, arrangement or understanding or any such like may result in or have the effect of collusive Biding. The Bidder undertakes that in the process of the Bid but prior to the HDA awarding the Bid to a preferred bidder become involved in or be aware of or do or caused to be done any agreement, arrangement or understanding or any such like for the purpose of or which may result in or have the effect of a collusive Bid, the Bidder will notify the HDA of such any agreement, arrangement or understanding or any such like.; or

 indirectly to any person for doing or having done, or causing, or having caused to be done any act or
 omission in relation to the RFP Process or any proposed response to RFP (provided nothing contained
 in this paragraph shall prevent a response to RFP from paying any market-related commission or
 bonus to its employees or contractors within the agreed terms of their employment or contract).

8.10. CONSORTIUM CHANGES

If exceptional circumstances should arise in which after the submission of the bid and after closing date of submission of bids, there is change in the composition of the members of the consortium, either through substitution or omission of any member of the consortium for the purpose of this RFP:



- The Bidder to RFP must notify the HDA in writing of the proposed changes supported by complete details of the material reasons for the changes, the parties impacted by the changes and the impact on the response to RFP.
- The HDA shall evaluate the reasons advanced by the Bidder for the requested changes to the Bidder structure and where the HDA is not satisfied that the reasons advanced are reasonable or material, refuse to accept the change and disqualify the response to RFP, or notify the Bidder in writing of its non-acceptance of the changes and require the Bidder to propose a suitable alternative to the HDA within 10 (TEN) days of its receipt of the decision of the HDA, upon receipt of which the HDA shall
 - i. Evaluate the alternative proposed for suitability to the HDA, and where the alternative is accepted by the HDA, inform the Bidder in writing of such acceptance and the HDA shall reassess the response to RFP against the RFP requirements and criteria; or
 - ii. Where the alternative is not accepted by the HDA, inform the Bidder in writing of such non-acceptance as well as its disqualification from the RFP Process.
 - iii. Where the HDA is satisfied that the changes requested under (i) above are reasonable and material, the response to RFP, shall be allowed to effect the required changes and the HDA shall reassess the response to RFP against the RFP requirements and criteria.

8.11. COSTS OF RESPONSE TO THE RFP SUBMISSION

All costs and expenses associated with or incurred by the Bidder in relation to any stage of the Project, shall be borne by the Bidder. The HDA shall not be liable for any such costs or expenses or any claim for reimbursement of such costs or expenses.

To avoid doubt, the HDA shall not be liable for any samples submitted by the Bidder in support of their Responses to RFP and reserves the right not to return to them such samples and to dispose of them at its discretion.



8.12.RESPONSE TO THE RFP WARRANTY

Bidders must provide a warranty as part of their Responses to RFP that their Responses to RFP are true and correct in all respects, that it does not contain a misrepresentation of any kind and that the taxes of all members of the Bidder company, consortium members and or subcontractors are in order and none of the members are undergoing corruption or any criminal-related investigations or have any past convictions for fraud or corruption.



9. CONDITIONS OF TENDER

General

Actions

The HDA's *Representative* and each *tenderer* submitting a tender shall act as stated in these Conditions of Tender and in a manner which is fair, equitable, transparent, competitive and cost-effective.

Interpretation

- Terms shown in *italics* vary for each tender. The details of each term for this tender are identified in the Request for Tender / Scope of work/ specification. Terms shown in capital initials are defined terms in the appropriate conditions of contract.
- Any additional or amended requirements in the Scope of work/ specification, and additional requirements given in the Schedules in the tender returnables are deemed to be part of these Conditions of Tender.
- The Conditions of Tender and the Scope of work/ specification shall form part of any contract arising from this invitation to tender.

Communication

Each communication between the HDA and a *tenderer* shall be to or from the HDA's *Representative* only, and in a form that can be read, copied and recorded. Communication shall be in the English language. The HDA takes no responsibility for non-receipt of communications from or by a *tenderer*.

THE HDA's rights to accept or reject any tender

- The HDA may accept or reject any variation, deviation, tender, or alternative tender, and may cancel the tender process and reject all tenders at any time prior to the formation of a contract. The HDA or the HDA's Representative will not accept or incur any liability to a tenderer for such cancellation and rejection, but will give reasons for the action. The HDA reserves the right to accept the whole or any part of any tender.
- After the cancellation of the tender process or the rejection of all tenders the HDA may abandon the proposed work and services, have it performed in any other manner, or re-issue a similar invitation to tender at any time.



Tenderer's obligations

The tenderer shall comply with the following obligations when submitting a tender and shall: Eligibility Submit a tender only if the *tenderer* complies with the criteria stated in the Scope of work/ specification. Insurance 9 Be informed of the risk that needs to be covered by insurance policy. The *tenderer* is advised to seek qualified advice regarding insurance.



Pricing the tender

- 10 Include in the rates, prices, and the tendered total of the prices (if any) all duties, taxes (except VAT), and other levies payable by the successful *tenderer*. Such duties, taxes and levies are those applicable 14 days prior to the *deadline for tender submission*.
- 11 Show Value Added Tax (VAT) payable by The HDA separately as an addition to the tendered total of the prices.
- 12 Provide rates and prices that are fixed for the duration of the contract and not subject to adjustment except as provided for in the *conditions* of contract.
- State the rates and Prices in South African Rand unless instructed otherwise as an additional condition in the Scope of work/ specification. The selected *conditions of contract* may provide for part payment in other currencies.

Alterations to documents

Not make any alterations or an addition to the tender documents, except to comply with instructions issued by the HDA's
Representative or if necessary to correct errors made by the tenderer.
All such alterations shall be initialled by all signatories to the tender.
Corrections may not be made using correction fluid, correction tape or the like.

Submitting a tender

Submit a tender for providing the whole of the works, services or supply identified in the Contract Data unless stated otherwise as an additional condition in the Scope of work/ specification.

NOTE:

- 16 Return the completed and signed Tender document and SBD forms provided with the tender.
- 17 Submit the <u>tender as an original</u> and an electronic version which must be contained in USB clearly marked in the Bidders name as stated. Tenders may not be written in pencil but must be completed in ink.
- Sign and initial the original tender where indicated. The HDA will hold the signatory duly authorised and liable on behalf of the *tenderer*.
- Seal the bid document in an envelope/package, the HDA's address and invitation to tender number stated in the Scope of work/ specification, as well as the tenderer's name and contact address should be written on the envelope /package. Where the tender is based on a



two envelop system tenderers must further indicate in the package whether the document is envelope / package 1 or 2. The envelope/package must be marked "CONFIDENTIAL".

20 Accept that the HDA will not assume any responsibility for the misplacement or premature opening of the tender if the outer package is not sealed and marked as stated.

Note:

The HDA does not to receive BIDS by post, and takes no responsibility for delays in the postal system or in transit within or between the HDA offices.

The HDA does not to receive tenders by fax, the HDA takes no responsibility for difficulties in transmission caused by line or equipment faults.

Where tenders are sent via courier, the HDA takes no responsibility for tenders delivered to any other site than the tender office.

The HDA employees are not permitted to deposit a tender into the HDA tender box on behalf of a tenderer.

Closing time

- 25 Ensure that the HDA has received the tender at the stated address no later than the *deadline for tender submission*. Proof of posting will not be taken by the HDA as proof of delivery. The HDA will not accept a tender submitted telephonically, by Fax or E-mail unless stated otherwise in the tender document.
- Accept that, if the HDA extends the *deadline for tender submission* for any reason, the requirements of these Conditions of Tender apply equally to the extended deadline.

Tender validity

- 27 Hold the tender(s) valid for acceptance by the HDA at any time within the *validity period* after the *deadline for tender submission*.
- 28 Extend the *validity period* for a specified additional period if the HDA requests the *tenderer* to extend it. A *tenderer* agreeing to the request will not be required or permitted to modify a tender, except to the extent the HDA may allow for the effects of inflation over the additional period.

Clarification of tender after submission

29 Provide clarification of a tender in response to a request to do so from the HDA's *Representative* during the evaluation of tenders. This may



include providing a breakdown of rates or Prices. No change in the total of the Prices or substance of the tender is sought, offered, or permitted except as required by the HDA's *Representative* to confirm the correction of arithmetical errors discovered in the evaluation of tenders. The total of the Prices stated by the *tenderer* as corrected by the HDA's *Representative* with the concurrence of the *tenderer*, shall be binding upon the *tenderer*

Submit bonds, policies etc.

- 30 If instructed by the HDA's *Representative* (before the formation of a contract), submit for the HDA's acceptance, the bonds, guarantees, policies and certificates of insurance required to be provided by the successful *tenderer* in terms of the *conditions of contract*.
- 31 Undertake to check the final draft of the contract provided by the HDA's *Representative*, and sign the Form of Agreement all within the time required.
- Where an agent on behalf of a principal submits a tender, an authenticated copy of the authority to act as an agent must be submitted with the tender.

THE HDA'S UNDERTAKINGS

The HDA, and the HDA's Representative, shall:

Respond to clarification

1 Respond to a request for clarification received earlier than the *closing time for clarification of queries*. The response is notified to all *tenderers*.

Issue Addenda

If necessary, issue to each *tenderer* from time to time during the period from the date of the Letter of Invitation until the *closing time for clarification of queries*, Addenda that may amend, amplify, or add to the *tender documents*. If a *tenderer* applies for an extension to the *deadline for tender submission*, in order to take Addenda into account in preparing a tender, the HDA may grant such an extension and the HDA's *Representative* shall notify the extension to all *tenderers*.

Return late tenders

3 Reject tenders received after the *deadline*. Tenders will be deemed late if they are not in the designated tender box at the date and time stipulated as the deadline for tender submission.

Non-disclosure

Not disclose to *tenderers*, or to any other person not officially concerned with such processes, information relating to the evaluation and comparison of tenders and recommendations for the award of a contract.

Grounds for rejection

5 Consider rejecting a tender if there is any effort by a *tenderer* to influence the processing of tenders or contract award.

Disqualification

Instantly disqualify a *tenderer* (and his tender) if it is established that the *tenderer* offered an inducement to any person with a view to influencing the placing of a contract arising from this invitation to tender.

Test for responsiveness

- 7 Determine before detailed evaluation, whether each tender properly received
 - meets the requirements of these Conditions of Tender,
 - has been properly signed, and
 - is responsive to the requirements of the *tender documents*.
- Judge a responsive tender as one which conforms to all the terms, conditions, and specifications of the *tender documents* without material deviation or qualification. A material deviation or qualification is one which, in the HDA 's opinion would
 - detrimentally affect the scope, quality, or performance of the works, services or supply identified in the Contract Data,
 - change the HDA's or the tenderer's risks and responsibilities under the contract, or
 - affect the competitive position of other *tenderers* presenting responsive tenders, if it were to be rectified.

Non-responsive tenders

10 Reject a non-responsive tender, and not allow it to be subsequently made responsive by correction or withdrawal of the non-conforming deviation or reservation.

Arithmetical errors

- 11 Check responsive tenders for arithmetical errors, correcting them as follows:
 - Where there is a discrepancy between the amounts in figures and in words, the amount in words shall govern.
 - If a bill of quantities applies and there is a discrepancy between the
 rate and the line item total, resulting from multiplying the rate by the
 quantity, the rate as quoted shall govern. Where there is an
 obviously gross misplacement of the decimal point in the rate, the
 line item total as quoted shall govern, and the rate will be corrected.



- Where there is an error in the total of the Prices, either as a result
 of other corrections required by this checking process or in the

 corrected.
- Reject a tender if the *tenderer* does not accept the corrected total of the Prices (if any).

Evaluating the tender

Obtain from a *tenderer* clarification of any matter in the tender which may not be clear or could give rise to ambiguity in a contract arising from this tender if the matter were not to be clarified.

Acceptance of tender

Notify the HDA's acceptance to the successful *tenderer* before the expiry of the *validity period*, or agreed additional period. Providing the notice of acceptance does not contain any qualifying statements, it will constitute the formation of a contract between the HDA and the successful *tenderer*.

Notice to unsuccessful tenderers

16 After the successful *tenderer* has acknowledged the HDA's notice of acceptance, notify other *tenderer*s that their tenders have not been accepted, following the HDA's current procedures.

Prepare contract documents

- 17 Revise the contract documents issued by the HDA as part of the *tender* documents to take account of
 - Addenda issued during the tender period.
 - inclusion of some of the tender returnables, and
 - other revisions agreed between THE HDA and the successful tenderer, before the issue of THE HDA's notice of acceptance (of the tender).

Issue final contract

18 Issue the final contract documents to the successful tenderer for acceptance within one week of the date of the HDA's notice of acceptance.

Sign Form of Agreement

Arrange for authorised signatories of both parties to complete and sign the original Form of Agreement within two weeks of the date of the HDA's notice of acceptance of the tender. If either party requires the signatories to initial every page of the contract documents, the signatories for the other party shall comply with the request.





1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The site is underlain by naturally deposited generally Quartenary Sands. The near-surface soils are described as generally very loose to lose, improving in consistency with depth. All trial holes dug were unstable to enter, and all were profiled from outside.

Groundwater was found on the southwest section(TP2, TP3, TP6, TP7, and TP8) of the site and along the natural sloping channels (TP12 and TP13). Groundwater is not expected to be problematic in the section selected for relocations.

Suitable earthmoving plants can be used for excavation purposes. The suitable battering of the side slopes will be required for areas in cut. In terms of long-term slope stability, all cut slopes should be constructed to gradients not greater than 1v:2.0h and should allow for the inclusion of a suitable erosion blanket and planting. Suitable wind erosion measures will also be required in the drier summer periods during construction.

In terms of the material utilization the sandy transported soils are suitable for use as structural fill and as G7 selected subgrade once suitably compacted. Due to the variability in the clay/silt content within the transported soils, careful selection of suitable material may be required on-site. Due to the fine-grained nature of the site soils, soil moisture content needs to be carefully controlled.

In Conclusion selected sites, "Site A" and site "Site B" as deemed suitable for the erection of informal "shacks" structures.

Should low-cost housing be considered for the same site, founding conditions for structures are regarded as unfavorable for conventional founding at shallow depths and will require improvement to ensure competent founding conditions.

The improved transported soils are suitable to support structures up to a minimum bearing pressure of 175 kPa. Should heavy structural loading of the subsoils be anticipated then investigation of the subsoil characteristics at depth will be required to assess the risk of adverse settlement. Small-diameter rotary boreholes (with Standard Penetration Testing) would be recommended for a deeper assessment of the subsoils.

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2. INTRODUCTION

On the 17th of April 2024, an appointment letter was issued to the Vhuluvhi group from Mr. Rinae Nnduvheni on behalf of Narian Morula JV, for a near-surface geotechnical investigation to be conducted on the vacant and pre-occupied site in Driftsands within the City of Cape Town in the Western Cape Province.

The geotechnical investigation has been conducted to assist with the identification of suitable sites and recommendations on preparation of layer works for the emergency relocations of temporary informal structures to Driftsands site A.

The work was undertaken in accordance with the National Department of Housing Geotechnical Site Investigations for Housing Developments Generic Specification GFSH-2 September 2002.

This report constitutes a near-surface geotechnical investigation of the above-mentioned specific development only.

2.1 OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY

The objectives of the investigation were to complete a near-surface geotechnical investigation that would provide sufficient geotechnical data and would:

- Identify the soil profile to a depth of approximately 3.0m or refusal of a TLB machine.
- Determine the engineering parameters of the near-surface soils.
- Recommend site-specific layer works preparations for the structures.
- Allocate Residential Site Class Designations, according to the NHBRC.
- Assess the suitability of the near-surface soils for use in earthworks and road pavement layers.
- Comment on any geotechnical problems that may impact the construction.

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3. FACTUAL REPORT

3.1 DESKTOP STUDIES

Prior to the commencement of any fieldwork, a desktop study was conducted on the data obtained from previous investigations by other consultants.

The 1:250 000 geological map, "No 3318 Cape Town" was consulted to determine the regional and local geology. To supply information regarding the topography of the site, the 1:50 000 topographical map, "No 3318DC BELVILLE" was referenced.

3.2 SITE DESCRIPTION

The site is situated on the previously known Driftsands nature reserve, and approximately 20km away from Cape Town. Driftsands is amid informal squatter shack settlements and low-cost housing, and it is adjacent to Khayelitsha township.

At the time of investigation, the site comprised of informal settlements and mining operations, vegetation and small grasses, and medium to large trees were observed within the vicinity of the site.

From a desktop review of the topographical map, "No 3318DC BELVILLE" it is evident that the site occurs at elevations ranging between 49m (amsl) and 35m (amsl). The site is situated on sand dunes terrain and most likely to gentle slope in all directions.

Surface runoff, particularly during periods of heavy or prolonged rainfall is expected to be in the form of sheet wash towards all directions. The location of the site is indicated on the Google site plan attached as Appendix B.

3.3 GEOLOGICAL DESCRIPTION

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From the desktop review of the 1:250 000 geological series map, "No 3318 Cape Town", it is evident that the site is underlain by Brackish and Calcareous soils belonging to the Quaternary age.

Based on published geological data, the terrain is known to be underlain by thick deposits of Quaternary age sands, in turn underlain by sedimentary strata of the Malmesbury Group, which comprises greywackes, mudrocks, and shales.

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These sands are known to vary between 10 to 15 meters in thickness in this area of Driftsands. The Quaternary material typically comprises naturally deposited fine to medium grained sands with, locally, layers of more silty to clayey material.

Due to the nature of transported soils, the consistency within the transported horizons can vary significantly.

An extract from "No 3318 Cape Town" a geological map of the area is included in Appendix C of this report.

3.4 CLIMATE AND HYDRO-GEOLOGICAL DESCRIPTION

The region receives between 595mm and 1015mm of rainfall per year, most of which occurs as heavy, isolated thundershowers between October and March.

Surface runoff, particularly during periods of heavy or prolonged rainfall is expected to be in the form of sheetwash towards all directions.

Various climatic environments influence the weathering of bedrock and residual soil development is best represented by Weinert's climatic N-value, and thus the climatic regime plays a fundamental role in the development of the soil profile and the weathering of rock.

Weinert (1964) demonstrated that chemical decomposition is the predominant mode of rock weathering in areas where the climatic "N-value" is less than 5. In areas where the climatic N-value is between 5 and 10, disintegration is the predominant form of weathering, although some chemical decomposition of the primary rock minerals still takes place. Where the climatic N-value is greater than 10, secondary minerals do not develop to an appreciable extent and all weathering takes place by mechanical disintegration of the rock.

Weinert's climatic N-value for the site is less than 5, and thus this implies that decomposition is the predominant form of weathering.

3.5 FIELD WORK - NEAR-SURFACE GEOTECHNICAL INVESTIGATION

Between the 18th and 19th of April 2024, a field investigation was conducted where 17 (seventeen) trial holes were excavated within the perimeter of the site using a TLB. The trial hole positions were set out in the field by the Vhuluvhi group's engineering geologist to provide a spread of information and were coordinated using a hand-held GPS.

The following samples were deemed necessary to be taken for laboratory testing: -

Foundation Indicator x 2

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- Ph & Conductivity x 2
- ITS x 1
- CBR x 2

Each trial hole "deemed" safe to enter was internally profiled by an engineering geologist according to the "Guidelines for soil and rock logging in South Africa", sampled as necessary, and then loosely backfilled. The site plan which appears in Appendix A indicates the trial holes.

3.6 OBSERVATIONS

While the nature of the soils encountered in the test pits is relatively uniform in terms of the type of material, there is a reasonable degree of variation in the thicknesses of the various horizons. Table 1 gives the test pit depth and whether or not there was water seepage encountered in the trial holes.

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3.7 LABORATORY RESULTS

A summary of the laboratory test results is given in Tables 2 and 3 while the detailed results are included in appendix F of the report.

For more accurate determination and classification purposes, particle size distribution and Atterberg Limits tests were carried out on representative samples of the various soil horizons present below the site. The results are summarised in Table 2 below: -

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3.0. INTERPRETATIVE REPORT

3.1. DISCUSSION OF RESULTS – TEST PITS

3.1.1. UNENGINEERED FILL

The unengineered fill was observed in only TP3 and TP4, across the site from the surface to a maximum depth of 250mm. This horizon has been depicted as a slightly moist, greyish brown, loose to medium-dense, silty sand.

No laboratory test was conducted on this horizon.

It is our opinion that this horizon should not be considered as a founding medium for any of the structures, due to its loose general consistency and unengineered nature.

This material should be cut to spoil, and not reused for any purposes.

3.1.2. QUATERNARY SANDS

This horizon has been described as slightly moist, greyish brown, generally loose to medium-dense consistency, sand.

This soil has a collapsible grain structure and is more likely to exhibit a collapse potential under load. This material was excavated to a maximum depth of 3.0m below the current ground level.

Laboratory testing results suggest that the residual sandstone exhibits a non-plastic nature and is thus reasonably fine-grained in texture.

CBR test results suggest that these soils have a maximum dry density of between 1686kg/m³ and 1681kg/m³ with an optimum moisture content of between 11.4% and 12.5%, and subsequently, it is classified between G7 and G8 according to COLTO and T.R.H 14 classification.

Furthermore, an ITS test was conducted on this material to further classify the soil when stabilized with 5% of cement, and this material when stabilized is more likely to classify on a firm G7 according to COLTO and T.R.H 14 classification.

It is our opinion that these materials be reused during the preparations of layer works, As this material is suitable as G7 selected subgrade once compacted to at least 98% of the Modified AASHTO density.

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3.2. GEOTECHNICAL MAPPING OF THE SITE

In order to map the geotechnical characteristics of the underlying soils, the classification method proposed by The Joint Structural Division of SAICE, and IstructE The Code of Practise entitled "Foundations and Superstructures for Single Storey Residential Buildings of Masonry Construction" as described in table 4 below.

Based on the visual inspection of the soil horizons made during the site investigation, the site is classified as C2.

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This recommendation should be implemented alongside all points raised in this report.

- We, therefore, recommend that this material be reused as G8 backfill, and quality control should be ensured through testing through the backfilling.
- Bulk excavation of at least 3.0m below the current ground level be done in preparation for layer works.
- Rip and compact the base of the excavations to 98% MOD AASHOT.
- Reuse the material on site, which classifies as G8, and compact to 98% MOD AASHOT in 150mm Layers until the current ground level is reached.
- Quality control should be conducted utilizing a density test or Troxler to check if the compaction percentage has been achieved.
- In Preparation for all the layer works, the site should be sloped into the natural sloping side of the site, so to avoid ponding of stormwater on site.

In Preparations of the site, According to NHBRC (2015), All trees should be rooted out within the parameters of the structures.

3.2. EXCAVATION CLASSIFICATION

In terms of SABS 1200D:1988 Earthworks, excavations to depths presented in Table 9 below are likely to classify as "Soft".

Given the largely unconsolidated sandy nature of the site soils, no significant problems should be experienced in excavating the potential sandy transported soils using suitable earth-moving equipment. It is anticipated in terms of SABS 1200D, that 'soft' excavation conditions will be encountered across the majority of the proposed site.

Should deep excavations be planned for the site, then measures to ensure both short and long-term will need to be implemented at the site. These measures would typically comprise suitable battering of the slopes to gradients not greater than 1v:2.0h or suitable shoring techniques installed.

It is further noted that this area is prone to wind erosion, especially when the vegetation is cleared and exposed to the elements. Measures need to be undertaken during earthwork activities to limit the extent of wind erosion, especially during the drier summer periods of the year.

Furthermore, the long-term stability of cut slopes must take into account erosion. Erosion protection in the form of vegetation measures such as a topsoil cover containing an erosion blanket should be installed on the slopes to provide erosion protection. Hydro-seeding or selected planting should be undertaken on the new cut slopes

It is recommended that the sides of any excavations deeper than 1.5m should be sloped to 1:1.5, to ensure sufficient slope stability to prevent collapse of the sidewalls. During periods of heavy rainfall however, the sides of the excavations should be regularly examined, to ensure the safety of the excavation for personnel and equipment working in them.

3.3. STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

It is assumed that all services on the site will be connected to those already present in the area and it is likely that most of the runoff, particularly during periods of heavy or prolonged rainfall is expected to be in the form of sheet wash towards all directions, subsequently feeds into the nearest stream on the south. Precautions must be implemented to prevent damp problems in the proposed structures.

3.4. GENERAL

Although every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of the information contained in this report, the results are based upon fieldwork. It is thus possible that localized soil conditions at variance to those described in the report may be encountered. It is recommended that the foundation excavations for each structure be inspected by a competent person during construction in order to verify that the materials thus exposed are not at variance with those described in the report and that it meets design criteria.

As indicated in section 2.6, all test pits must be loosely backfilled upon completion of the fieldwork. In order to avoid the possibility of localised settlement occurring below structures and or internal roads due to the consolidation settlement of this loose backfill, it is

It is recommended that all excavations should be inspected by a competent person, prior to placing any concrete or backfill material.

4.2. CONTROL TESTING

Regular checks on the quality and compaction of the backfill to the terraces should be made.






Soil Profile as observed in TP2








Soil Profile as observed in TP4

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT July 2010

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if (applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

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General Conditions of Contract

1. Definitions

- 1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
- 1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.
- 1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7 "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.
- 1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the

RSA.

- 1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such

obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.

1.25 "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2. Application

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3. General

- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

4. Standards

4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5. Use of contract documents and information; inspection.

- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6. Patent rights

6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7. Performance security

- 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

8. Inspections, tests and analyses

- 8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.
- 8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department.
- 8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.
- 8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.
- 8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.
- 8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.
- 8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or

analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9. Packing

- 9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.
- 9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10. Delivery and documents

- 10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.
- 10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11. Insurance

11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12. Transportation

12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13. Incidental services

- 13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:
 - (a) performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
 - (b) furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
 - (c) furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;

- (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
- (e) training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.
- 13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14. Spare parts

- 14.1 As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:
 - (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
 - (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15. Warranty

- 15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- 15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take

such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16. Payment

- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

17. Prices

17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized in SCC or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

18. Contract amendments

18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19. Assignment

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20. Subcontracts

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21. Delays in the supplier's performance

- 21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.
- 21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.
- 21.3 No provision in a contract shall be deemed to prohibit the obtaining of supplies or services from a national department, provincial department, or a local authority.
- 21.4 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the

supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

- 21.5 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.
- 21.6 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without canceling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22. Penalties

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23. Termination for default

- 23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:
 - (a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2:
 - (b) if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - (c) if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any

person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.

- 23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer / Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.
- 23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:
 - (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
 - (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
 - (iii) the period of restriction; and
 - (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

- 23.7 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.
- 24. Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights
- 24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a
 provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is
 increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is
 not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of
 any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional
 payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or
 countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such
 provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable
 difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the
 State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any)
 which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or
 services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in
 terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which

may be due to him

25. Force Majeure

- 25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.
- 25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26. Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27. Settlement of Disputes

- 27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.
- 27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.
- 27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.
- 27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.
- 27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,
 - (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and
 - (b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28. Limitation of liability

- 28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;
 - (a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and

(b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29. Governing language

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30. Applicable law

30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

31. Notices

- 31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice
- 31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32. Taxes and duties

- 32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid the Department must be in possession of a tax clearance certificate, submitted by the bidder. This certificate must be an original issued by the South African Revenue Services.

33. National 33.1 Industrial Participation (NIP) Programme

The NIP Programme administered by the Department of Trade and Industry shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.

34 Prohibition of Restrictive practices

- 34.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder (s) is / are or a contractor(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding (or bid rigging).
- 34.2 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser, has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998.
